

# A MESSAGE FROM ECAM PRESIDENT- Dave Cook

# September Board of Directors Meeting Highlights

The ECAM Board of Directors is comprised of a cross section of Industry members; residential, industrial, commercial, urban and rural, sub-contractors, engineers and associate members. The Board meets monthly September through June and is served by standing committees, advisory councils and working groups.

#### **BACnet Designs**

Grant Wichenko, President of Appin Associates, updated the board on evolving BACnet design practices. Traditionally, in construction contracts, the data from equipment (CRACs, UPSs) came from a third party BACnet or proprietary gateway that were supplied and installed by a third-party integrator or the Controls Subcontractor. However, the industry is changing and equipment suppliers provide and install BACnet gateways at the factory. The BACnet information is now a component that is managed from design submittal to installation as well as the commissioning and turnover processes outlined in the Construction Agreement. Appin's Networked Controls Model supports MEP trades by aligning with current Trade Definitions and responsibilities. The ECAM board recognizes the need to anticipate industry changes and may suggest reviewing trade definitions and engaging in proactive discussions to adapt accordingly.
